When children work together to make the parachute billow, they also develop their perceptual motor skills and sense of rhythm.

The children enjoyed exploring our wilderness area on Wednesday afternoon. They hunted for minibeasts, made leaf necklaces and spotted birds. We are firm believers that playing and learning amongst wildlife has huge
