Well-Being

This week I would like you to think of what you'd like to be when you grow up (please let me know!) Draw a picture of yourself in this job role and label the picture with the things you'd have to do as part of that job or think about what qualifications/subjects you might need to study to achieve your dream. You might need to do some research into this. Just for fun, you could play the Yes/No game with your family and make it all about jobs. Someone thinks of a job and the others must ask questions to try and guess the job they're thinking of.

English

Read, read, read! **Reading challenge for this week:** Summarise your favourite story in less than 30 words-this is trickier than it sounds!

See if one of your family members can find them all! **Super challenge:** create your own silly story using words that use silent letters e.g. The knight had a calf, a gnome, a scientist and a lamb on his favourite sword.

Use the link to remind yourself what commands are and how we write them.

Create a biography for Shirley Hughes (you might need to do some research first). A biography is a text about someone's life. I have put a biography for Florence Nightingale in your resource pack, you might want to read this first to give you some ideas about what you want to write/research. I have also put a biography template in your resource pack that you could print/use to give you some extra help.

Mathematics

Complete your Early Bird Maths questions for each day (it doesn't have to be first thing in the morning!)

This week we are focusing on **statistics**.

In your resource pack, I have put examples of tally charts and pictograms. Can you make your own tally chart and pictogram? It might be a tally chart for how many items of clothing you have or a pictogram to show the different types of fruit in your fruit bowl-get creative! You could even make a large-scale pictogram using actual objects rather than drawing them!

Have a go at the statistics reasoning problems in your pack (you don't need to do ALL of them!) Remember to explain your answers clearly.

Super challenge: make your own reasoning problem like the ones in your pack. Draw a tally chart/pictogram and write questions for someone else to answer or make a mistake and see if they can spot it!

Science

Create an A-Z Nature Scavenger Hunt. Try to think of something in nature beginning with each letter of the alphabet-try and think of things for our local area/country (I'll be very impressed if you can do all 26 letters). Write the word and draw a picture next to it. When you next go out for a walk, take your scavenger hunt and see how many things you can spot.

Try the 'Fireworks in a glass' experiment in your resource pack. I'd love to see pictures of this! You could even write about what you did/what happened afterwards.
