

For English, please have a go at the following activities:

- Read! Read books, share stories, listen to audiobooks. Write a review of your favourite one!
- Create a 'Twisted Fairytale'-rewrite a fairytale and change the ending or swap the good and bad characters!
- Create a 'book scavenger hunt' for someone/yourself e.g. find a book with a dragon in it, find a book by an author whose surname starts with a 'B' etc.
- Order your books alphabetically by title/author.
- Plan a birthday party for your favourite toy. Write the invitations, a list of what you need, a recipe for a birthday cake, posters, birthday cards, thank you cards etc.
- Research an Indian city/animal/landmark and create/write a factfile about it-or do a few and make your own India book!!
- Our author for the next half term was going to be Shirley Hughes. Can you find out about some of the books she has written? Read them, retell or review them!

Our topic for next term is Incredible India. Have a go at some of these activities:

- Research a famous Indian landmark and make it out of junk modelling/ Lego.
- Research the meaning behind henna tattoos. Draw around your hands and create your own henna tattoo designs.
- Make some Indian food: curries, naan bread, chapattis etc.
- Research Indian animals then draw and collage your favourite one.
- Compare a city/town in India with Masham-what is similar? What is different?

For maths, please have a go at the following activities:

- Practise times tables (2s, 5s and 10s)—chant them, write them as a list, make them from objects, use TT Rockstars. Draw 'Hopscotch' on the ground but count in a times table instead of just 1-10.
- Follow a recipe and measure the ingredients carefully using scales and measuring jugs.
- Use Numbots to practise your addition and subtraction.
- Create a 'Measure Scavenger Hunt' and complete it e.g. find something that is 15cm long, find a container that can hold 1 litre of water etc.
- Play 'Headbands'. Someone writes a number and sticks it on your head. Ask Yes/No questions to try and work out the answer!
- Practise telling the time on an analogue clock whenever you can-when is tea time? How long is it until bed time? Etc.
- Create your own Snakes and Ladders game. Count up to 100 or in a times table. Make your own counters and dice!

Our Science topic for next term is Weather and Seasonal changes:

- Keep a weather diary; include day length, temperature etc. Can you spot any patterns?
- Look at the weather in India and compare it to weather in the UK.
- Design an outfit for each of the different seasons.
