Thank you for all of your support with the children's homework. There has been some great home learning, in particular the PowerPoints that some children have chosen to create. This week in Burn Class Year 4 will be learning about efficient subtraction and strategies for checking answers, while Year 5 will Look at inverse operations and Multi step addition and subtraction problems.
