At Masham Church of England Primary School we have been allocated £16,600 in Sport Premium Funding for the academic year 2024/2025. We have a projected spend of £14,935.48.

We aim to use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education, Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) on offer to pupils. This means we will use the funding to develop or add to the PESSPA already in place in school (referring to the aims and key indicators below) and to make improvements now for future pupils.

The National Curriculum aims are for all children:

- To be physically active, working towards a target of 30 minutes activity during and after the school day (excluding general play times)
- To excel in a broad range of activities
- To engage in competition
- To lead healthy lifestyles

At Masham we aim to meet the curriculum expectations with the help of the Sport Premium Funding by providing:

- A more inclusive curriculum
- A growth in sporting activities offered to the children of Masham
- Improvements in our partnership work with other schools in the local area
- Opportunities to take part in competitive sport

The Sports Premium Statement is broken down into 5 key indicators (listed below) and the funding is spent according to where improvements are to be made or provision is to be continued.

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
