
Her Majesty The Queen

A message from Mrs Clark

Burn Class have made a great start to the new school year and have already looked at two poems by Lewis Carroll. This week we will be continuing our work on poetry writing our own stanzas for the poem A Strange Song and another Lewis Carroll poem, The Jaberwocky, which we will learn to perform. You may wish to help your child in learning this poem at home, thinking about performance. We will be using these poems in our artwork this term. In maths we have already looked at the Roman numeral system and are now moving onto representing number up to 10,000 (Year 4) and up to 1,000,000 (Year 5), reading and writing numbers and understanding the place value of each digit, including partitioning. There are some videos on place value on BBC Bitesize which may help in understanding this area of

As we launch our geography topic we are starting to look at finding the continents of the world in an atlas and exploring their geographical features along with locating countries where rainforests are located on world maps. All children will have their book bands reviewed this week and should have a new book and reading record. Please remember to sign and record any reading your child has done at home, which should be at least three times per week.

A message from Mr Scott

This week in Cover Class we will be continuing to read our exciting class novel, Room 13. As well as developing key reading skills we will be looking at sentence structure leading towards narrative writing in the form of a character description. In maths we will continue learning about increasingly large numbers, up to and across 1 million. We'll also continue our Geography learning by investigating the features of different continents and oceans before looking more specifically at South America and the rainforest.
